### SPRING TRAININGS OF LUHS SU

Spring trainings of LUHS SU took place on May 24-27. This time took place in a slightly different format as they were split into online and live meetings that took place over a few days. On the first day, the coordinators of the social, academic and representative committees introduced the members to the importance of their activities, deepened and reminded them of the importance of representation at the university, why it is important to do it and how it benefits the student. They also shared their experiences of how SU started its activities and motivated members to continue their activities in the representation and to improve the organization and thus the activities of the university. On the second day of the online training, a meeting was held with LUHS Development Management Manager, LUHS SU alumni Laurynas Jarukas. The conversation was very interesting to tell how he changed and rebuilt the SA's operations, how he tried and cared about the continuity of its operations. Laurynas also shared her experience of how belonging to SU can benefit in the future and in her work, that it is not just unpaid work, but an experience that teaches and expands personal opportunities. Motivated to continue his work, pursue goals, and not give up at work. We were grateful for a very interesting meeting.

Live meetings took place on days 26-27. May 26 the theoretical part of the information committee, led by another LUHS SU alumni Airimas Vasiliūnas, took place. The day also consisted of a practical part, during which the members were divided into two groups and learned to take professional photos both outdoors and indoors - determining focus, brightness, flash intensity and composing photo content, looking for ideas and trying to capture them beautifully. ## INFORMATION ON RESIDENCE PLACES

We share a particularly happy message for the 6-year Integrated Medicine Studies and the entire LSMU student community! There have been very long and tedious negotiations: the expulsion of SA and its return to the State Procurement Committee, letters to the relevant institutions, meetings with the government, and so on.

However, today, after the government meeting, the news reached us that instead of 320 state-funded residencies, we will have 365 seats! The following places will be allocated to priority areas:

- family medicine,
- internal diseases,
- emergency medicine,
- children's diseases,
- psychiatry and child and adolescent psychiatry,
- geriatrics,
